**Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drugs**

<b>Bill/Authors</b>	<b>Summary</b>	<b>Status</b>
<b>SB 1078</b> S: Nichols H: Worthen	Amended to include language similar to SB 1066 – adding 3.2 beer to social host law, and providing for graduated penalties for repeat offenders. <b>FINAL LANGUAGE:</b> Strips away the amendment above – which was the entire reason for the bill! However, the final version did retain the provision that holds adults liable if great bodily injury occurs (not only if a death occurs) at a party they are hosting and providing minors with liquor or a controlled dangerous substance.	<b>CCR Passed Senate 38/6. CCR Passed House 90/1.  SIGNED BY GOVERNOR</b>

**Childhood Obesity**

<b>Bill/Authors</b>	<b>Summary</b>	<b>Status</b>
<b>HB 1601</b> ob H: Hickman S: Jolley	<b>FINAL LANGUAGE:</b> Clarifies that recess does not count toward the required 60 minutes per week of physical education in grades K-5. Requires school districts to provide parents with an annual report summarizing the physical activity opportunities, and suggestions for encouraging physical activity by their children. Creates Task Force to formulate recommendations regarding P.E. requirements in Oklahoma public schools.	<b>CCR Passed House 88/7.  CCR Passed Senate 43/2.  SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.</b>

**Safety**

<b>Bill/Authors</b>	<b>Summary</b>	<b>Status</b>
<b>HB 1686</b> safety H: Nations S: Rice	<b>FINAL LANGUAGE:</b> Requires any child under 18 to wear helmet when operating or rider an ATV. Makes it unlawful to carry a passenger on an ATV unless it is specifically designed to carry passengers. Provisions apply only to public lands, and not to privately-owned property. Redefines ATV as having two (2) wheels and being 48” long. Provides for parents to incur fines for allowing children to ride without a helmet, or to be a passenger on an ATV.	<b>SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.</b>

## Health Care

<b>Bill/Authors</b>	<b>Summary</b>	<b>Status</b>
<b>SB 424</b> <small>health</small> S: Adelson H: Cox	<b>FINAL LANGUAGE:</b> Creates the All Kids Act, directing the Oklahoma Health Care Authority on or before January 1, 2011 to establish and maintain a program with a voucher and/or other subsidy to provide medical coverage assistance to children, eighteen (18) years of age or younger, whose family incomes are between one hundred eighty-five percent (185%) and three hundred percent (300%) of the federal poverty level. Funding shall be provided from unused funds from the Oklahoma Employer/Employee Partnership for Insurance Coverage (O-EPIC), not to exceed \$8 million. Directs OSDH on or before January 1, 2011 to expand the Postponing Sexual Involvement program to areas of the state with high rates of births to teens. Funding shall be provided from unused funds from the Oklahoma Employer/Employee Partnership for Insurance Coverage (O-EPIC), not to exceed \$500,000.	<b>CCR Passed Senate 41/7.</b> <b>CCR Passed House 68/27.</b>  <b>SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.</b>
<b>HB 1303</b> <small>health</small> H: Enns S: Adelson	<i>Would have</i> authorized Oklahoma Health Care Authority to cover prenatal care for immigrant women, whose babies would be born U.S. citizens.	<b>To Conference.</b> <b>Not Heard – DORMANT.</b>
