

## Legislative Advocacy

### OICA's Legislative Report Card.

The Oklahoma Legislature had an overall score of 85% on OICA core issues, showing the efficacy of advocacy efforts. Further, 13 Representatives and 7 Senators earned "perfect" scores for their voting records on OICA issues. The governor earned a 95% score on OICA core issues.



### Child Advocates Release "Report Card" for Lawmakers

OKLAHOMA CITY – The Oklahoma Institute for Child Advocacy (OICA) today released its 2019 Child Well-being Legislative Report Card. The Report Card tracks 25 key pieces of legislation related to the health and safety of Oklahoma children and rates lawmakers based on their voting record. The bills were selected by the Advocacy Committee for OICA.

Overall, the Legislature received a score of 85 – or a letter grade of "B". Lawmakers were rewarded for passing a budget that included funding for more immunizations at county health departments and more services for children with disabilities. Other positive accomplishments included the restoration of a tax credit for families with foster children and the adoption of "healthy relationship" curricula in public schools.

There are almost 8,000 children in Oklahoma's foster care system. Most of those are kids under 12 years old, and many of them also have brothers and sisters in the system. Needless to say, it is important for the state to recruit and retain foster parents so that all these children have loving and safe homes.

Foster parents are performing one of the most important, selfless acts that we can ask of our fellow Oklahomans. If you are a foster parent and are reading this, thank you for your service and the compassion you are demonstrating. If you are a foster parent, you also know that opening your home.

The weekly "For the Children" column reaches more than a million Oklahomans through dozens of local papers which carry it. The column also is distributed electronically to more than 20,000 online OICA online subscribers.

A pair of weekly newsletters – one to OICA Members only the other to a wide distribution list – get OICA issues and insights to more than 20,000 online subscribers.



The OICA Desktop Calendar gets important childcentered facts and statistics, as well as the names of child advocates and OICApartner organizations onto the desks of lawmakers, agency directors, and executive branch officials. It is also shared on OICA social media pages each morning.



Social media connects have grown significantly in 2019 as we now have more than 7,200 Facebook followers, more than 2,300 Twitter followers, and more than 1,000 Instagram followers. The pages are updated multiple times daily, with an average of 17 new posts each week – and more when events warrant.


